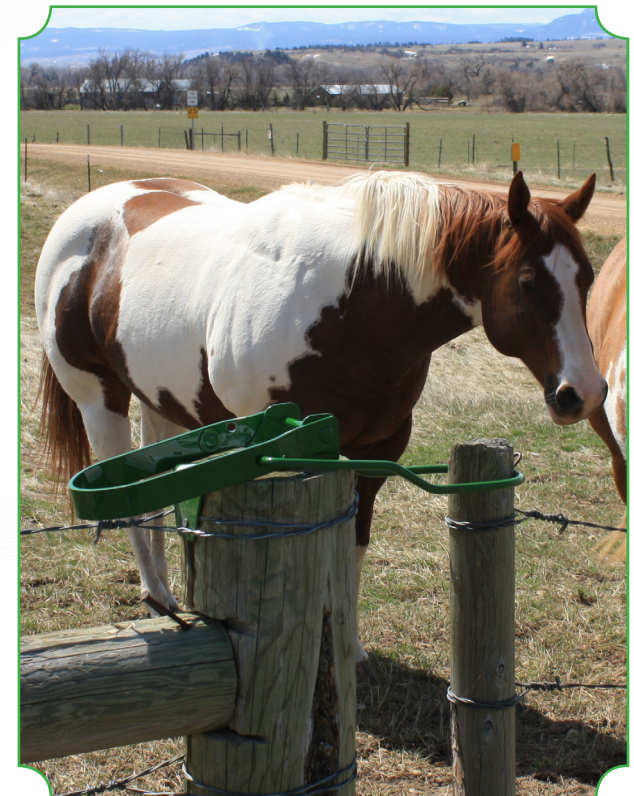

## The Tru-Latch



The Tru-Latch features our “Cam-over positive locking” system and an easy-to-pull handle.



It also features a padlock hole to lock the gate and keep out any intruders, or simply for added gate security.

## Installation



Begin by placing the posts parallel to each other and pull the fence until it is taut.



Secure the tab down with another nail.



Using 24D pole barn nails, position the latch in place on top of the post.



Then, using a fencing staple...



Start the top nails in, making sure to have the gate latch in the correct position



Secure the gate latch to keep it from sliding up the post.



Using a dead-blow hammer, pound the hanging-over tab down.



Your gate latch is now installed and “built to last a lifetime.”
